Joseph V. Camposeo has been the Town Clerk of Manchester since 1996. Prior to being elected and appointed Town Clerk, Joseph served as both a member and the secretary for the Board of Directors from 1991-1996, and as a member of the Board of Education from 1978-1988.

Joe is past President of the Connecticut Town Clerks Association. Prior to becoming President, Joe served as Chairman of the Legislative Committee as well as the association's first Vice President.

Joe is a member of: New England Association of City and Town Clerks; an Executive Board member of the National Association of County Recorders (NACRC) and serves as its Connecticut State Coordinator; a member of the National Property Recorders and Property Records Industry Associations. In his tenure as Town Clerk, he has been named to various committees for legislation, technology, education, elections and historic preservation.
